Academics

One fine day, teachers dropped in and asked us to pick up chits, each for one group, and need to express it to the class in such a way that they are in position to decode it after three minutes or by the end of the description, the chits contained names like Charlie Chaplin, Painter, Balloon, Flower and Maggi. We all were amazed as what kind of assignment is it? Is it for fun or just to kill the time? However, very soon we realised the whole idea and the strategy, the underlying concept was to introduce various skill set to us in a very friendly manner where in individual skills are blossomed and each ones thinking, creative skills can be gauged.
