It's time for KAHOOT

A webinar was organized by the Internal Quality Assessment Cell of MES' Pillai College of Education & Research, Panvel on 3rd September, 2020 on "Online Assessment Techniques". The resource person was Dr. Prashant Lokhande. Assessment of students seems to be most affected due to the online teaching-learning. Even though we have found ways of online teaching-learning assessment techniques have to be accepted and used effectively. Dr. Prashant demonstrated the use of KAHOOT, which enables a

Webinar on Transformational Learning

Webinar on Critical Thinking: Tools and Techniques for Teachers - 26th September, 2020

IQAC of **PCER** Panvel organized the webinar on developing critical thinking tools for teachers and the session was conducted by Dr. Chetan Date. President, Business Quality Systems. The lecture focussed on some of the tools and techniques that Dr. Date has

found useful during his career in Aerospace industry and academia. Critical Thinking is a structured and disciplined process that enables collection, synthetization, analysis, and interpretation of information to make inferences, provide explanations, solve problems, and make decisions. Every human being thinks- thinking is a natural act. But most of the thinking is also ad-hoc and emotional. It is based on personal experiences, biases, beliefs, prejudices, and in many cases subject to human irrationality. Critical thinking, on the other hand, is deliberate, disciplined, structured, and self-guided. It challenges the status quo; it explores motives and reasons. The deliberations on these aspects were very useful for the teachers.

World Habitat Day: 1 minute habit formation

A famous quote by Fiona Apple says, "Home is where my habits have a habitat." As humanity grows and evolves, the impact of this evolution is seen and felt by not just those around us, but by nature and biodiversity as well. Pillai College of Education and Research, New Panvel – Lead College for online University of Mumbai exams

With the ongoing nation-wide lockdown imposed in March 2020, the exams of semester 2 and semester 4 students of B.Ed. and M.Ed. could not take place at the right time. This was the case with most degrees.

University of Mumbai decided to conduct the pending exams using online mode in October 2020. It was decided by Board of examinations, UoM that there will be cluster colleges created for ease of conducting online exams. Each cluster had one lead college. PCER Panvel




was declared as the lead college for the upcoming exams with 8 other colleges in its cluster. In the first exams, all the colleges decided to avail the services of MKCL appointed by UoM for conducting exams. The exam paper consisted of 25 multiple-choice questions with four options, each question carrying 2 marks. The examin-charge of each college was trained to work with MKCL software. Uploading the student data, exam paper and actual live exam were part of the training. All the regular as well as ATKT exams were conducted with great success. There were minor glitches which were sorted out quickly.

The exams of academic year 2020-21 were also conducted in the online mode and PCER Panvel was again declared to be the lead college. Under the able guidance of principal, Dr. Sally Enos, all the exams were conducted using Google Meet, Google forms and Google Classrooms. Different colleges took up the responsibility of creating question papers of multiple choice as well as descriptive answers. Many sets of exam papers were created in Google Form and uploaded in specially created Google Classrooms. Google Meet link of the supervisors were created to conduct the exams. All the logistics were carefully considered and exams were conducted in a smooth manner. Teachers were allocated the paper assessment duties and once it was complete, marksheets were prepared and shared with other colleges.

PCER Panvel has the privilege of being a lead college with 8 cluster colleges working together to complete 3 semester exams of the University of Mumbai successfully!!!

NAAC Sponsored webinar 3rd to 5th February, 2021 A NAACwebinar sponsored "Qualitative & **Quantitative** Metrics in Assessment of TEIs as per NAAC Guidelines 2019" was organized by the IQAC of MES' Pillai College of Education and Research, New Panvel from 3rd to 5th February, 2021. After the inaugural session attended by a galaxy of excellent people from different areas of expertise. In the



1st session on 'NAAC's Assessment & Accreditation Process-An Overview' Dr. Devender Kawday familiarized the participants with his extensive yet crisp overview of the Assessment and Accreditation process. He gave simple examples, apt examples, tips and explained the entire A&A process right from registration. He quoted, "when you change the way you look at things, the things at which you look at change". He said that to be successful we must have quantity of quality; we must become a better version of ourselves; competition is with self. It is especially important for an institution that undergoes the NAAC process to have team members who have the passion to enhance the quality of the institution. The session was interesting and highly informative.

The session 2 of day 1 of the webinar was on Quantitative metrics w.r.t NAAC criteria for TEIs. The speaker of the session was Dr. Priam Pillai, COO, Mahatma Education Society & Associate Professor at PCE, Panvel. He brought out the importance of the SOP and highlighted the need of extensive documentation. He took the criteria- Metric wise on focused on exactly where to get the details, giving important and helpful tips on how one could merge the tables from the manual and SOP and have a comprehensive view. He helped all to focus attention on sorting the quantitative metrics and addressing them weightage wise so as to give justice to its scope. He was very thorough with different aspects of the criteria & gave his ideas on ways of working towards it and patiently answered all queries of the participants.




Our expert for the 1st session on day 2 was Dr. Shilpa Puranik, from Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur. She guided us through the various aspects of criterion 1: Curricular Aspects. This session took us through the qualitative and quantitative aspects of the criterion and the requirements of documentation for upload. Each subcriterion was well-explained with examples. She also emphasized on

how the curricular aspects have to be customized to the vision and mission of the institution and then activities must be thought out.

The second session of the day was on criterion 2: Teaching-Learning and Evaluation. The expert for this session was Dr. Sunita Wadikar, former Principal Pillai College of Education and Research, Chembur. The session clarified the various aspects of the criterion with many examples and tips. Understanding how the learners learn, teachers have to change their ways of teaching. Having knowledge of the learners when they enter the course is extremely important as it lays down the base for the way, the course can be implemented for the students. She emphasized that evaluating and assessing students for their learning and using an array of tools and techniques to do the same is important.

In the afternoon, in the post lunch session, Dr. Shirish Chindhade mesmerized the audience with his in-depth deliberation on the second most important criterion in the A&A process. The entire NAAC process revolves around these aspects Process, Feedback and Outcomes. He elaborated on every aspect of the criterion; supported his deliberation with examples and tips. He warned us that NAAC is like a tiger that we are riding on and that we must ride carefully. He rightly pointed Excellence is a process and a permanent pursuit, so we need to keep putting

our best efforts to enhance the quality of our institutions.




Marathi Basha Diwas celebrations

Cultural activity 2021


